<p>Write the number 0-20 on card and get an adult to mix them up. How long does it take for you to put them in order?</p>	<p>During spring, seeds begin to grow. In the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, Jack's beans grow into a magic beanstalk. Tell the story of Jack and the beanstalk with a grown-up and act it out together.</p>	<p>Can you fill a cup with water? Can you fill two cups? Do they hold the same amount of water? How do you know?</p>	<p>Design a map of a farm or zoo. Think carefully about where the animals are going to sleep, exercise and eat. Do you need roads and paths? Ponds or trees?</p>	<p>Create a picture using only circles or squares in the style of Kandinsky.</p>
<p>Choose 20 blocks and build a model. Can you use the same blocks to build a different model?</p>	<p>Choose a new book to read. Stop reading in the middle of the story. Can you guess what will happen at the end? Were you right?</p>	<p>Make a parachute out of a plastic bag. Drop it from different heights. Add a plastic toy to it. Does it make it go slower? What happens if you make the parachute smaller or bigger?</p>	<p>Create a family tree showing any siblings, parents or carers, grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins you have.</p>	<p>Have a go at creating a 'space' scene as a model using whatever you can find at home. You can choose anything you like to make it with.</p>
<p>Hetty the Hen had 10 eggs. On Monday 4 eggs hatched into chicks. How many eggs were left in Hetty's nest? You could draw a picture of the eggs to help you work out the answer.</p>	<p>Can you draw your house? Can you label your picture? Roof, window chimney, door and wall.</p>	<p>Make a weather chart to show what the spring weather is like. Draw a picture of the weather each day.</p>	<p>Look outside a window at the front of the house and a window at the back of the house. What can you see? Can you see the same things from both windows or are the views different? Write a list of the things you can see from both windows and compare them.</p>	<p>Create a 2 D or 3D blossom tree. Use your hands and fingers to print a beautiful tree covered in blossom or use a stick from the garden and tissue paper.</p>
<p>Go on a 2D shape hunt around your house. How many squares, circles, triangles or rectangles can you find? Did you find more of one shape than another? Which shape was the hardest/ easiest to find?</p>	<p>Write your name, using a different colour for each letter. Remember to add the smiles.</p>	<p>Go on a Mini beast hunt in your garden. Make a list of all the insects you find and record which was the most popular.</p>	<p>How have you changed since you were a baby? Draw and label a timeline of you from being a baby until now. What can you do now that you couldn't do when you were a baby?</p>	<p>Get a mirror. Filling up a whole A4 piece of paper, carefully draw a self-portrait. Remember all the sketching and shading skills we have already practised.</p>
