


Linford Class Year 1 Home Learning Challenges

<p>Create your own number cards 0-50. Choose 5 cards. Can you put them in order? Choose two numbers. Add them together.</p>	<p>Write an alternative blurb for your favourite book.</p>	<p>Look outside at night time. Can you see the moon? Draw a picture of what it looks like.</p> <p>Keep doing this for 1 week. What do you notice?</p>	<p>You are all so knowledgeable about Florence Nightingale.</p> <p>Write about the differences between nurses today and nurses in Florence Nightingales time.</p>	<p>Create a picture using only circles or squares in the style of Kandinsky.</p>
<p>Play games such as Snakes and Ladders, Frustration, Dominoes or any other track games involving a dice and counting.</p>	<p>Write the instructions of how to wash your hands. Then read them to an adult to see if you have included everything!</p>	<p>Make a parachute out of a plastic bag. Drop it from different heights. Add a plastic toy to it. Does it make it go slower? What happens if you make the parachute smaller or bigger?</p>	<p>Create a family tree showing any siblings, parents or carers, grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins you have.</p>	<p>Have a go at creating a 'space' scene as a model using whatever you can find at home. You can choose how you show the scene, the size and the materials.</p>
<p>Use a ruler to measure objects around your house. How many centimetres (cm) long are they? Can you find any objects which can be measured in metres (m)? Record your findings.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"></p> <p>Choose a character from a story and write a description about them. Remember to include adjectives.</p>	<p>Complete a materials hunt in your home!</p> <p>What materials can you find? Which materials were the most common?</p>	<p>Look at a map of the United Kingdom. Can you find 3 rivers and 2 lakes? Which is the longest river? Which is the largest lake?</p>	<p>Think back to all of the modes of transport we have been learning about. Choose one and create your own sketch or use lego blocks/ materials to create a print.</p>
<p>Can you make some 2D and 3D shapes using materials in your home? Pencils, sticks, straw or even Lego are all great for this challenge!</p>	<p>Ask an adult to read Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall out loud to you. Write down the words they are saying in your best handwriting, remember to use capital for proper nouns.</p>	<p>Go on a Mini beast hunt in your garden. Make a list of all the insects you find and record which was the most popular.</p>	<p>Create a timeline from birth to the present day. How have you changed? What can you do now that you couldn't do when you were a baby? What would you like to be able to do that you can't do yet?</p>	<p>Get a mirror or a recent picture of yourself. Filling up a whole A4 piece of paper, carefully draw a self-portrait. Remember all the sketching and shading skills we have already practised.</p>
